



INSTRUCTION FOR CANDIDATES

EDUCATION QUALIFICATION

CLASS I TO 5 (LEVEL I)

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least **50% marks** and passed or appearing in 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known)

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least **45% marks** and passed 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known) in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition, Norms and Procedure) Regulation, 2002.

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least **50% marks** and passed or appearing in 4-year Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed).

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least **50% marks** and passed or appearing in 2-year Diploma in Education (Special Educaton).

OR

Graduation and two year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known) passed or appearing in this course.

CLASS 6 TO 8 (LEVEL II)

Graduation and 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known) passed or appearing in this course.

OR

At least **50% marks** either in **Graduation or post Graduation and B.Ed. passed** or appearing in Bachelor in Education (B.Ed)

OR

Graduation with at least **45% marks** and **1-year B.Ed. passed**, in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition, Norms and Procedure) Regulations issued from time to time in this regard.

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least **50% marks** and passed or appearing in **4-year Bachelor in Elementary Education (B.El.Ed)**.

OR

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Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least **50% marks** and passed or appearing in **4-year B.A. /B.Sc.Ed. or B.A.Ed./B.Sc.Ed.**

OR

Graduation or post Graduation with at least **50% marks** and **B.Ed. (Special Education)** passed or appearing in B.Ed (Special Education)

Note:- NCTE Notification Dated 13th November, 2019 "At least 50% marks either in Graduation or in Post-Graduation and B.Ed." the following Proviso inserted-"Provided that minimum percentage of marks in graduation shall not be applicable to those incumbents who had already taken admission to the Bachelor of Education or Bachelor of Elementary Education or equivalent course prior to the 29th July, 2011."

GENERAL INSTRUCTION

1. Each question has five options marked as 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. You have to darken only one circle (bubble) indicating the correct answer on the Answer Sheet using **BLUE or BLACK BALL POINT PEN**.
2. After obtaining the question paper booklet and carefully reading it, ensure that all its pages are complete, no page is damaged and the question numbers are in the correct order. The damaged/faulty question paper booklet must be replaced within 10 minutes of the commencement of the examination.
3. All the questions in the question paper booklet will be **multiple choice**. Each question will have **four options** for answer in the form of A, B, C and D, out of which only one answer has to be selected.
4. There is **no negative marking** in this exam.
5. All questions carry equal marks. Each question carries **1 mark**.
6. The question paper of **Level 1** is divided into **five sections** as per clause 4.1 and it is compulsory to solve the correct section. **The language in sections II and III** should be selected as per clause 4.1 and it should be as mentioned in the application form. Marks will be awarded as per the subject selected by the candidate, in case of any error in this, the candidate himself will be responsible.
7. The question paper booklet of **Level 2** is divided into **four sections** as per clause 4.2 and it is compulsory to solve the correct section. **The language selection in sections II and III** should be done as per clause 4.2 and it should be as mentioned in the application form. In section IV, the language selection should be done as per clause 4.2 A, B and C which should be as mentioned in the application form. Marks will be awarded as per the subject selected by the candidate, in case of any mistake in this, the candidate himself will be responsible.
8. Here will be five options for each question in the answer sheet but there will be **four options A, B, C, D for each question** in the question paper. Candidates have to choose the correct option from these four options and mark the corresponding circle in the answer sheet as **blue/black**. If the candidate does not want to answer any question, then circle the **fifth option E** in the answer sheet as black. If the circle of any of the five options given in the answer sheet is **not blackened/blue**, then **1/3rd** of the question mark will be deducted for such a question. If the candidate does not mark any of the **five options for more than 10 percent** of the total questions, then he will be considered disqualified.



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9. **REET – 2024 Certificate Validity** – The validity of REET certificate has been made **lifelong from 2022** by the Elementary Education (Organizing Department) of Government of Rajasthan.
10. At the examination centre, the applicant will be given a **blue/black ball pen** and a **downloaded admit card** for entry into the examination hall along with one **original photo identity card** (such as Aadhaar card) which you had uploaded with the application.
11. **Multi-level biometric authentication** and **PAT frisking** will be carried out as per prevalent instructions at the time of entry into the examination hall and during the examination as required.
12. The use of electronic devices and mobile phones, calculators, Bluetooth, jewellery etc. is strictly prohibited in the examination hall.
13. Candidates will be allowed to enter the examination centre only till the **reporting time for the examination**.
