

### Pattern of Exam

**LEVEL – 2 (Class 6 to 8)      Max. Marks : 150, TIME : 2.30**

#### Level 2 will have questions in four sections:-

**Section I :** Child Development and Teaching Methods (30 Multiple Choice Questions 30 Marks)

**Section II :** Language I - Hindi/English/Sanskrit/Urdu/Sindhi/Punjabi/Gujarati (Language I must be selected from the list of languages mentioned in the application form. The language used in this section will be the same as the medium of instruction, which has been selected in the online application.) (30 Multiple Choice Questions 30 Marks)

**Section III :** Language II - Hindi/English/Sanskrit/Urdu/Sindhi/Punjabi/Gujarati (Language II must be selected from the list of languages mentioned in the application form. Which has been selected in the online application. But it will be different from the language selected as Language I.) (30 Multiple Choice Questions 30 Marks)

**Section IV :** (A) For Mathematics and Science Teacher - IV (A) Mathematics and Science Subjects

(B) For Social Studies Teacher - IV (B) Social Studies subject

(C) For teacher of other subject - any one of IV (A) or IV (B)      (60 Multiple Choice Questions 60 Marks)

**Note :-** If for any reason the candidate has solved the questions in a language other than Language I and Language II mentioned in the application form, then it will not be considered valid and his/her exam result will be prepared according to the language filled by the candidate in the application form. Any change in this will not be accepted.

#### Level and nature of questions:-

1. In the 'Child Development and Teaching Methods' paper, questions will be asked to test the understanding of educational psychology related to the level of reading and teaching of children aged 11 to 14 years, various mental levels of students, their needs, interactions with them and the qualities and characteristics of a good teacher etc.

2. In the Language I paper, questions will be asked to test the proficiency related to the language mentioned while filling the application. Which he has indicated in the application form.

3. Language II must be selected from the language list mentioned in the application form. Which he has indicated in the application form, but it will be different from the language selected as Language I. In this paper, questions will be asked to test the general understanding, communication and comprehension ability of Language II.

4. In the question papers of 'Mathematics and Science' and 'Social Studies' subjects, questions related to concept, problem solving ability and study skills of the subject will be asked.

5. The standard of multiple choice questions will be based on the syllabus and subject matter of the academic session 2024-25 prescribed by the State Government for classes 1 to 5, but the difficulty level of the questions will be up to Senior Secondary (Class 12).

6. The language medium of the question paper (except language subjects) will be bilingual in Hindi and English.



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## Minimum qualifying marks for REET 2024:-

As per the State Government order dated 16-12-2020, the minimum eligibility marks for the following categories have been determined as follows.

**Note :-** 1. As per the clarification letter of the State Government dated 05-07-2024, all men and women (including widows and abandoned women) of ST category in TSP area will be eligible on the prescribed minimum passing marks of 36 percent.

2. As per the State Government letter dated 25-06-2024, for the candidates of outstanding sportsperson category, the minimum qualifying marks determined on the basis of the category to which the application is being made will be valid.

3. As per the State Government Gazette dated 29-08-2012, minimum qualifying marks of 36% have been prescribed for the candidates of Scheduled Tribes of Scheduled Areas.
